507 Air Base Squadron emblem: On a sky blue shield, bordered brown, between a white star in dexter chief and an Air Force yellow control tower emitting electric flashes in sinister base, a

brown eagle flying through a large red "V" pointing to dexter base; clutched in his right talons six Air Force yellow beams radiating to dexter base; eagle, beams and "V" highlighted white. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The white star signifies faithfulness to duty. The eagle portrays the 507th Air Base Squadron as "Watch Bird" over field controlling. The six beams radiating from the eagle's talons symbolize each specific function of the Squadron. The red "V" represents jets, and the tower is symbolic of our Squadron, always on call to perform specific duties. (Approved, 15 Oct 1956)
