Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 15 October 1921 as the 509th Attack Squadron, assigned to the 328th Attack Group (GHQR), and allotted to the Ninth Corps Area. Initiated on 26 May 1922 at Seattle, WA. Withdrawn from the Ninth Corps Area on 31 March 1924 and allotted to the Fifth Corps Area. Concurrently, reorganized and redesignated as the 509th Pursuit Squadron and assigned to the 352nd Pursuit Group (GHQR). Cincinnati, OH, designated as headquarters on reorganization, but the unit was never organized at that location. Reorganized and redesignated as the 509th Transport Squadron on 1 October 1933, but remained assigned to the 352nd Pursuit Group. Status: Disbanded on 31 May 1942.
