# **OPERATIONS**

Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 15 October 1921 as the 510th Attack Squadron, assigned to the 328th Attack Group (GHQR), and allotted to the Ninth Corps Area. Initiated on 21 October 1922 at Everett, WA. Withdrawn from the Ninth Corps Area on 31 March 1924 and allotted to the Fifth Corps Area. Concurrently, reorganized and redesignated as the 510th Pursuit Squadron and assigned to the 352nd Pursuit Group (GHQR). Reorganized by December 1924 at Indianapolis, IN. Inactivated by March 1930 at Indianapolis by relief of personnel. Reorganized and redesignated as the 510th Transport Squadron on 1 October 1933, but remained assigned to the 352nd Pursuit Group. Disbanded on 31 May 1942.
