OPERATIONS

In Dec 1943, the squadron was sent to Coalinga Municipal Airport to maintain the field during the winter. The Airport had a pretty fair field and a hangar. The hangar was used for administrative offices and as a mess hall. All maintenance was accomplished on the parking line. The only housing facilities for the ground crew were tents. During the cold weather the only source of wood supply for the stoves in the tents came from the oil derricks. Coalinga was set up as separate operation from the home base (Lemoore). Operations were under the command of Maj George E. Smith, commander of the 529th. Crash trucks and ambulances were available at all times during flying operations. Civilian guards were employed to patrol the field every night from 1700 until 0700. The "Coalinga Expedition" was considered a big success.
