### EMBLEM



58 Bombardment Squadron emblem re was n0 warning that first morning at Pearl Harbor. The mustard-yellow planes of the Japanese had descended low enough to make visible the emblem of the Rising Sun on the wings before if was known that the attack had begun. Long lines of American planes were hammered to pieces on their hangar ramps by murderous bombs that fell like rain. But some got off with half-clothed pilots at the controls. These made the Japanese pay dearly for their treachery. If and when the Japanese planes return to Pearl Harbor, the skies will tremble at their reception. Among those in the receiving line will be the 58th Bombardment Squadron of Hickam Field. Their whimsically terrifying Disney bulldog in flying togs will be eager for his chance to snap at Japanese heels. He will also be able to pass the time profitably by dropping "pineapples" on any deserving enemy target.
