EMBLEM

On a disc per fess Azure and Gules, in chief five rays Or, surmounted by a stylized lion head to dexter of the second, details and mane Sable, highlights Argent, a fess of the last charged with barbed wire of the fourth, in base a stylized flight line of the like, all within a narrow Black border. Below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "532D EXPEDITIONARY SFS" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations.

Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The lion's head alludes to dominance on the battlefield, the mane further symbolizing the pursuit of justice with the waves illustrating dynamic assault in the combat environment. The barbed wire separates the flight line from the Squadron's primary area of operations outside the base perimeter. The field surrounding the flight line is symbolic of the blood spilled by defenders of air bases worldwide. The flight line symbolizes purity and devotion to duty--a commitment to defend the airfield with their lives, if necessary.
