549<sup>th</sup> Strategic Missile Squadron emblem: On a rectangular area arched in chief and base, per pale dark blue spattered with white stars and Air Force blue, the top of a silver-gray globe issuing from base, grid lines dark blue; all surmounted by a white missile palewise pointing upward shaded silver-gray, emitting an Air Force golden yellow blast-off vapor cloud to base, edged white, surmounting the vapor cloud an armored hand, dark blue, highlighted white and shaded silver-gray, grasping three white lightning streaks edged red; encircling the missile a white stylized olive wreath. (Approved, 2 Mar 1962)

## **OPERATIONS**

The 549th Strategic Missile Squadron was the first SAC operational unit to have ICBMs - the Atlas Missile. They were deployed near SAC headquarters at Offutt AFB, Nebraska, most likely so that

the brass could be close by to establish procedures, etc. Prior to that, the missiles were only assigned to the training units at Vandenberg AFB, California.

A combat ready crew from 549 SMS successfully launched an Atlas missile from Vandenberg Air Force Base, CA 11 Apr 62.

During 1962, 549 Strategic Missile Squadron maintained a round the clock alert posture of assigned Atlas D missiles following Golden Ram modification of missiles. 1962

Four crews from 549 SMS participated in missile launching from Vandenberg AFB, CA 1962

Light fixed wing aircraft test terminated on 15 Jan 62 and indicated urgent requirements for air transportation in support of 549 SMS missile sites

1964 anticipated phasing out of Atlas D missile and inactivation of 549 Strategic Missile Squadron.
