Combat in ETO, 17 Jul 1943-21 Apr 1945. Combat in Southeast Asia, 8 Apr-15 Aug 1965. Replacement training, 1 Jan 1966-30 Sep 1970. Electronic warfare training and operations, late 1975-Oct 1989. Undergraduate navigator training, 1993-1996.

563rd Flying Training Squadron Inactivated As part of an Air Force and Navy decision to consolidate some training, AETC inactivated the 563 FTS at Randolph AFB on 3 June 1996. AETC transferred its electronic warfare officer training from Randolph to Corry Station, Florida, when the command moved portions of the navigator training to NAS Pensacola.

On 30 April 1999, AETC activated the 563d Flying Training Squadron to run the electronic warfare courses that had moved from Corry Station, Florida, to Randolph AFB. The first students entered the newly fashioned primary navigator training at Randolph on 5 April, while the last Air Force students graduated from training at Corry Station on 18 June 1999.
