564th Air Service Group's 995th Air Engineering Squadron would provide maintenance that was beyond the capability of the combat group, its 1002nd Air Materiel Squadron would handle all supply matters, and its Headquarters & Base Services Squadron would provide other support.

Redesignated as an air base group, reconstituted, and activated at Otis AFB in 1952. It replaced the 33rd Air Base Group as host unit for Otis. Assigned eight squadrons to perform its support responsibilities. Also maintained aircraft stationed at Otis. Redesignated as an air defense group and assumed responsibility for air defense of the Boston area. It was replaced by the 33d Fighter Group (Air Defense) on 18 August 1955
