569th US Forces Police Squadron emblem: On a disc Azure, a six pointed star Argent in fess point charged with a stylized eagle, wings displayed Sable eyed of the field, beaked, langued and footed Gules in fess point, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "TO SERVE AND PROTECT" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "569TH US FORCES POLICE SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The star is an established symbol of security forces, with six points representing law enforcement, security, crime prevention, resource protection, traffic supervision and ground defense services provided for the local military and surrounding civilian communities. The eagle represents the strong, concerted teamwork between the unit and host-nation law enforcement officials in delivering the highest level of police services and force protection integrity to the local community. All elements combined reflect the motto, "To Serve and Protect."
