EMBLEM



On a disc per fess debased arched, orange and red, within a border black, piped white, four playing cards (aces) arranged spades, diamonds, clubs, and hearts, reading from dexter to sinister, issuing from arched segment in base, all behind a knave with evil facial expression, wearing black suit, orange collar, black hat of three points, trimmed and balled in each point of red. (Approved, 10 May 1943)

CREATOR OF THE 570TH JOKER"

While at Blythe Army Air Base and just two days after the initial orders from the 34th Bomb Group, Major Tom Jeffrey, the newly appointed Deputy Commander, directed each squadron to develop a distinctive emblem that would set it apart from each of the others. There are many historic references to such a technique. This emblem would be made a patch to be worn on the uniform. Major Jeffrey suggested each squadron commander run a contest within his squadron for the design of such an emblem.

The 570th Squadron Navigator Marshall Shore and Bombardier Don Ventriss had their office in an army tent out behind the building where Captain Joe Gemmill, the Squadron Commander, and First Lieutenant Bill Jones, the Operations Officer, had their office. There was no floor or lights and Ventriss and Shore sat on folding chairs in the sand. Ventriss had some background in illustrating and came up with the idea of an old English "Joker" which was superimposed on four playing card aces, spades, diamonds, clubs and hearts. He drew it out on a table and then put it up on a makeshift easel to color it in with water colors. The task took him two days to finish.

When he got it perfected to his satisfaction, he submitted it in the 570th Bomb Squadron competition. It was so original and different that it was voted the winner of the competition. It

was officially approved 10 May 1943. Unfortunately none of the other three squadrons gained official approval.

Combat in ETO, 12 Aug 1943-20 Apr 1945.

The 390th SMW and 570th SMS at Davis-Monthan AFB, Arizona, became the first Titan II wing and squadron to be activated. Titan II wings had two 1 x 9 squadrons. The missile used storable liquid propellants, all inertial guidance, carried a larger reentry vehicle than the Titan I, and could be launched from its silo. 1 January 1962

Headquarters SAC declared the 570th Strategic Missile Squadron (ICBM-Titan II) at Davis-Monthan AFB, Arizona, to be operational. This was the first Titan II ICBM squadron to achieve this status. 8 Jun 1963
