### EMBLEM

On an AF Blue disc, bordered red, outlined black, a robot composed of different electronic components, his tube-like body white, AF blue, grey and green; his box-shaped head, legs, and feet white, facial markings and other detail outlined black; his arms and hands red; holding a

phone to his face with his right hand and wearing earphones, all white outlined black; four large AF yellow lightning flashes radiating from his box-shaped head; the robot riding astride a large AF yellow missile, outlined black; holding in his left hand chain-like reins, black and white, attached to the nose of the missile; the missile portrayed flying through the sky; below the missile to the dexter (right) of the disc, a radar tower issuing from base, white, framework black; emitting four flashes from the top of the tower, all AF yellow, outlined black. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The significance of the various components of our 586th Communications and Guidance Squadron emblem is as follows: The basic circular shape conforms to that of the emblem of the original 69th Tactical Missile Squadron. The blue background denotes the basic color used by the Air Force. The missile depicted on the emblem represents the types of missile guided by this Sq. The robot, composed of different electronic components, is symbolic of the primary mission of our 586<sup>th</sup> Communications and Guidance Squadron. (Approved, 4 Apr 1957)
