OPERATIONS

The following year witnessed a large number of redesignations at Travis. On 1 April 1990, the 60th Air Base Group was renamed the 60th Combat Support Group. This was meant to emphasize its combat-oriented mission. Then on 1 August, all the maintenance squadrons were redesignated: the 60th Avionics Maintenance Squadron became the 60th Component Repair Squadron, the 60th Field Maintenance Squadron became the 60th Equipment Maintenance Squadron, the 60th Organizational Maintenance Squadron became the 60th Aircraft Generation Squadron, and the 602nd Organizational Maintenance Squadron became the 60th MAC maintenance concept designed to develop an organizational structure and process that would function in the same manner in peacetime or wartime.

Also on I February the 60th and 602nd Aircraft Generation Squadrons were realigned from the 60th Logistics Group to the same operations group. The intention was to place under one commander all the personnel who serviced, loaded and flew the C-5s and C-141s. This arrangement did not prove to be satisfactory, so on I August 1995 these two units were realigned again with the 60th Logistics Group.
