EMBLEM

Azure, issuant from dexter a lightning flash bendwise sinister Or between in chief a mullet Argent charged with a Taeguk fesswise and a stylized bald eagle disarmed and displayed fesswise White detailed Sable, winged Black garnished White, the head arching to dexter base of the third, beaked and eyed of the second detailed Black and langued Gules, all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "607TH AIR OPERATIONS GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and

Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle represents the strength and ferocity of the Group's combat aircraft. The lightning bolt signifies power projection upward to the sky. The white star denotes the Group's affiliation with the 7th Air Force. The Taeguk describes the balance of peace that the Group helps to maintain.
