Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "607TH SUPPORT GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence

required of Air Force personnel. The American bald eagle symbolizes the United States Air Force and the protection it provides to global allies, which is a central part to world security. The three lightning bolts to the left symbolize communication, information, and management. The three to the right signify support, civil engineering, and the unit's ability to stand ready to defend the United States of America.
