EMBLEM



Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The disc is divided yellow and blue suggesting day and night and the squadron's round the clock operations. The knight in armor springing from clouds symbolizes the combat readiness of the unit and the security and protection it provides for Air Force resources.
