### **EMBLEM**

Celeste, a fillet pall Azure between, in chief the astral constellation of the Southern Cross Argent, in dexter a lightning flash bendwise Or, garnished Gules, and in sinister a condor volant Proper, wing displayed in bend sinister, all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "612TH THEATER OPERATIONS GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The four pole stars denote the Southern Cross, the prominent astral constellation in the Southern Hemisphere and the unit's

area of responsi	bility. The lightning flash alludes to the unit's swiftness and readiness to respond
to all missions.	The condor is representative of the power and endurance required of the unit in
flight.
