## **OPERATIONS**

On I July 1993 when the 15th Air Force came to Travis, the 615th Air Mobility Operations Group was activated and assigned to it. This group provided a cadre to support worldwide air mobility

operations and a means to respond to taskings beyond the capability of a recently downsized en route structure in the Pacific. In other words, the Air Mobility Operations Group deployed and established an en route structure where needed. On the same date, the 702nd Air Mobility Operations Squadron changed its numerical designation to the 615th and was assigned to the group. Altogether the 615th Air Mobility Operations Group consisted of six squadrons (mobility, mobility control, mobility communications, aerial port, maintenance, and combat camera) and about 1,200 personnel.
