OPERATIONS

On 1 Aug 1983, the 625th MASS was inactivated and two new Squadrons were formed -- the 625th Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron and The 625th Aerial Port Squadron. These two new squadrons combined with the airlift Coordination center and the forward supply location to form the new 625th Military Airlift Support Group.

Effective 1 June 1992, with the activation of Air Mobility Command and the reorganization of the overseas en route support Structure, the 625th MASG and its two squadrons -- the 625th CAMS and 625th APS were inactivated. In its place, the 625th Airlift Support Squadron was activated at Torrejon AB, Spain.
