Provides programs, policies, services, and facilities to a combined military/civilian force of 7,300 personnel in support of the 628th Airbase Wing and both 437th & 315th Airlift Wings. The multi-service mission for Joint Base Charleston consist of communications, contracting, supply, transportation, logistical support, civil engineering, personnel, security, law enforcement, family support, and morale, welfare and recreation (MWR) services.

EMBLEM

Per bend Gules and Azure, between a pair of stylized wings elevated Argent (Silver Gray), a fouled anchor Or, rope Brün, charged with a mullet Argent, bearing a torteau; all within a diminished bordure of the fourth. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "628TH MISSION SUPPORT GROUP" in Blue letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The bottom background denotes the strength and power of the Air Force. The wings are symbolic of the Group's mission of supporting Joint Base Charleston and the units assigned there. The anchor represents the unit's continual efforts to provide outstanding support to all customers. The Hap Arnold star depicts both the significance of Air Force heritage and the unit's unique place in that heritage as one of the organizations activated specifically to support a joint base.
