### **EMBLEM**

On a disc Azure, in chief the star cluster known as the Big Dipper from the constellation Ursa Major Argent with a flight delta point to dexter chief Or, emitting a contrail bendwise between stars on the handle of the dipper and embowed to base issuant from sinister Silver Gray, surmounting the contrail a snow-covered mountain range of five peaks issuant from base Sable, covered and charged by a parachute of the second; all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "FUNDING ARCTIC DEFENSE" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "673D COMPTROLLER SQUADRON" in Yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The mountain backdrop and the star constellation Ursa Major are symbols of the unit's Alaskan location with its climate and geographical challenges. The parachute and aircraft symbol signify the joint Air Force and Army mission the unit supports. The upward contrail signifies the striving towards higher levels of support. (Approved, 24 Jun 2010)
