## **EMBLEM**

On a disc Celeste, in base a terrestrial demi-globe Proper, issuing from dexter a stylized airfoil Gris, contrail Or, soaring to chief launching three air-to-air missiles of the second, contrails of

the third to sinister arcing to dexter side and dexter base, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "ACTA NON VERBA" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "695TH ARMAMENT SYSTEMS SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The air vehicle launching three air-to-air missiles represents past, current and future weapons systems. This takes place in the airspace above the earth, symbolizing the reach of US airpower across the world and is demonstrated harmoniously with the unit motto, "ACTA NON VERBA."
