EMBLEM

Per pale Argent and Azure gridlined as a globe counterchanged, a cross Gules charged with a caduceus Silver Gray; all within a diminished bordure of the second. Attached below the disc a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "714TH AES" in Blue letters. Significance: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red cross, international symbol of medical care, reflects the mission of the unit. The silver Caduceus, a winged staff with two serpents entwined and superimposed on the cross alludes to the medical profession and flying mission. The two-colored stylized globe suggests that the unit is ready to complete mission assignments 24-hours a day. (Approved, 26 Dec 1996)
