EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a mullet throughout Argent, charged with a plumed helmet Gules detailed Sable, debruised in sinister base by a sword saltirewise point up Proper, all within a narrow border Red. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed "DISCE AUT MORERE" in Red letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Red border and inscribed "714TH TRAINING SQ" in Red letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The sword represents the ties between the Squadron and the 314th Air Wing as well as virtue, valor and strength. The star is symbolic of the unit's ties to the historic Army Air Corps symbol. The helmet is representative of Athena's war helmet (Goddess of Wisdom/Education). (Approved, 28 Aug 2006)
