Per bend sinister Silver Gray and Celeste, issuing from base a demi-globe Azure gridlined Or and in chief four mullets Argent, overall a lightning flash bend–sinisterwise of the fourth interlaced by a flight symbol fesswise of the fifth, all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "721ST AIR MOBILITY OPERATIONS GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe and four stars represent the unit's theater of operation--Atlantic Area, Europe, Middle East and Africa. The flight symbol signifies the airlift missions the unit supports, and where it touches the ground represents the ground support provided by aerial port and maintenance personnel. The lightning flash depicts the flow and continuity of the Air Mobility Command System, passing through the flight symbol, demonstrating the interaction of aircrew, command and control, and ground support functions which, though separate, are dependent on each other for successful mission accomplishment.
