## **EMBLEM**







The radar sail above the eagle is indicative of a radar unit. The blue globe indicates the mobility of the unit with a worldwide capability. The lightning circling the globe shows the quick reaction capability that encompasses the world. The American Eagle depicts American freedom, strength and courage. Transmission waves from the radar sail to the eagle symbolize control of aircraft using radar; the waves from the eagle's mouth to the stylized aircraft indicate voice communication to control aircraft. The star and wings represent the tactical aircraft, and the lightning the communications systems. The clenched fist is the control over the aircraft by the squadron's air control center.
