736 Security Forces Squadron emblem: On a disc Azure, in chief a parachute Argent, issuant from sinister base a demi-globe Vert, gridlined Sable, surmounted by and issuant from honor point an eagle stooping to sinister body, eyed and langued of the last, head and tail of the second, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "INVENIRE MORARI DESTRUERE" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "736TH SECURITY FORCES SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The parachute represents the unit's airborne capability--one of only three Air Force Security Forces Squadrons with this program. The eagle personifies the ability to react decisively and rapidly to any contingency. The globe symbolizes the unit's capability for deployment to over 42 countries within its AOR.

The 36th Wing at Andersen AFB, Guam, opened a new commando warrior technical training facility at the base's Northwest Field Jan. 20. The wing's 736th Security Forces Squadron will use the facility to train about 1,500 airmen per year in robust combat skills before they deploy in support of operations in Afghanistan and Iraq. Prior to its arrival, such training had to be conducted at dispersed locations across the base. According to Lt. Col. Troy Roberts, commander of the 736th SFS, the facility is the first-of-its-kind consolidated training campus in the Pacific region. In addition to airmen, the Air Force will be able to train military members of Pacific partner nations at the facility. Train, organize, equip and lead cross functional forces providing initial Air Force presence potentially austere forward operation location as directed by commander Pacific Air Force.
