#### **OPERATIONS**

Olathe AFS, KS CPS-4; FPS-3; FPS-4; FPS-20A; FPS-6A (2) FPS-20A; FPS-6A (2) 1952 08-Sep-68 Collocated with former Olathe NAS. USAF site shared with Army for Nike missile-defense system, Kansas City (KC-65DC). Was FAA site afterwards, but now closed altogether.

The 738th AC&W Squadron began operations in 1952 using AN/CPS-4 and AN/FPS-3 radars. The AN/CPS-4 soon was replaced by an AN/FPS-4 set that in turn was superseded by a pair of AN/FPS-6A sets in 1958. In 1958 this site also replaced the AN/FPS-3 set with an AN/FPS-20 search radar. In late 1959 this station was also performing air-traffic-control duties for the FAA. Olathe AFS was tied into the SAGE system in December 1961. In the early 1960s the search radar was upgraded and redesignated as an AN/FPS-66. In September 1968 the Air Force deactivated the 738th Radar Squadron.

738th Radar Sq (SAGE): activated 1 Feb 53 at Olathe AFS, KS, assigned to 33rd AD; transferred to 20th AD 1 Mar 56; transferred to Kansas City ADS 1 Jan 60; transferred to Sioux City ADS 1 Jul 61; redesignated from ACF/W Sq to 738th Radar Sq (SAGE) 1 Jan 62; transferred to 30th AD 1 Apr 66; discontinued 8 Sep 68.
