The 745 Air Force Band has just celebrated its 5th birthday on Barksdale having originally arrived here in October, 1949.


The thirty-one member band is one of the three bands in Second Air Force, one of the ten Strategic Air Command, and one of approximately seventy-three bands in the United States Air Force.

The duties of the 745th Band includes furnishing music for military formations, concerts, and social functions including dances at the Officers' NCO and Service Clubs.

The band also makes numerous appearances in local and outlying communities in parades, concerts, and dances in connection with events sponsored by or honoring military or veterans organizations.

The band is often 'on the road' to other Second Air Force Bases performing for the same type functions as they do here at Barksdale.

Out of the thirty-one members, the band has a marching band, a concert band and several dance band combos. The special insignia worn on their hats designates the wearer as a member of a United States Air Force Band.
