778th Radar Sq (SAGE): activated 1 Mar 51 at Simpsön, Mt, assigned to 545th ACFW Gp; transferred to 29th AD 6 Feb S2; site redesignated to Havre AFS, MT 1 Dec 53; transferred to Great Falls ADS 1 Jul 60; redesignated from AWN Sq to 778th Radar Sq (SAGE) 1 Mar 61; transferred to 28th AD 1 Apr 66; reassigned to 24th AD 19 Nov 69; inactivated 29 Sep 79.

MONTANA Simpson/Havre

In 1952 the 778th AC&W Squadron began operating AN/FPS-3 and AN/FPS-4 radars at this site. The Air Force added an AN/GPS-3 in 1956 that stayed until 1962. The site was integrated into the SAGE system in 1961. The AN/FPS-3 remained operational into the early 1960s while two AN/FPS-6 models took over height-finder duties. The 778th was deactivated in September 1979.

778 Havre AFS, MT FPS-3; FPS-4; FPS-6; GPS-3; FPS-6B (FPS-90) FPS-27; FPS-6 1952 01-Jul-79 BUIC-III. Earlier known as Simpson AFS.

In 1952 the 778th AC&W Squadron began operating AN/FPS-3 and AN/FPS-4 radars at this site. The Air Force added an AN/GPS-3 circa late 1958 that stayed until 1965. The site was integrated into the SAGE system in 1961. In the early 1960s AN/FPS-6 and AN/FPS-6B radars took over height-finder duties. The AN/FPS-6B was upgraded to an AN/FPS-90 in 1964; it was deactivated in 1969. In 1965 an AN/FPS-27 replaced the AN/GPS-3 as the search radar. Havre AFS ceased operations on 1 July 1979, and the 778th Radar Squadron (SAGE) was inactivated in September 1979.
