# **EMBLEM**

On a disc Azure, issuant from base a brick wall embattled arraswise Or mortared and shaded Gold Brown supporting a demi-lion salient arraswise Proper, all within a diminished border Blue. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "786TH COMMUNICATIONS SQ" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a

narrow Blue border and inscribed "KING" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The embattled wall suggests a castle and reflects the unit's steadfast solid foundation of communications support. The lion symbolizes the strong and persistent leadership spirit exhibited by Squadron personnel as they administer communication needs in an ever-changing technological world. This Squadron spirit and mastery of technology connote their reign over the communications area.
