EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, an unrolled parchment bendwise Buff, pierced by the AETC torch Proper, surmounted by a quill bendwise sinister throughout Argent. All within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "YOU GOT IT WE BOUGHT IT" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "802D CONTRACTING SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The paper represents the contractual documents, painstakingly negotiated and awarded at both home and abroad on behalf of the 502d Air Base Wing and the United States Air Force. The quill represents integrity displayed by Squadron personnel. The torch of knowledge represents the continuous education necessary to develop the Squadron's premier acquisition professional.
