EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a pair of hands in base Argent, holding a globe Celeste, gridlined Sable, surmounted by a torch Or, enflamed Gules, environed by contrail terminating as a delta in dexter of the field, all within a narrow bordure Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "TO SERVE AND SUSTAIN" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "802D FORCE SUPPORT SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. A pair of hands holding a globe represents the far-reaching global support provided by the force support squadron. The contrails and delta encircling a flamed torch symbolizes the combined missions of the Services, Manpower and Personnel career fields. (Approved, 27 Aug 2010)
