On a disc Azure, a globe Or gridlined Sable, supported by Atlas Silver Gray, emitting from sinister side of the globe and contrailing its point to dexter a stylized aircraft symbol of the last, all fimbriated and detailed of the third, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "ALWAYS THERE SELDOM SEEN" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "802D OPERATIONS SUPPORT SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel and the fact that the sun never sets on the OSS. The Atlas figure symbolizes world class strength, endurance, service and support.
