EMBLEM

On a blue disc, a brown stylized mountain range in base bearing three green cacti; in chief, a yellow flight symbol on a diagonal from upper right to lower left piercing a red nuclear symbol; all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc a blue scroll edged with a narrow yellow border. Motto: Attached below the disc a blue scroll edged with a narrow yellow border inscribed MAINTAINS EXCELLENCE in yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The missile represents the Ground Launched Cruise Missile System maintained by the squadron's personnel and the role of the squadron in training personnel that deploy the missile system around the world. The nuclear symbol depicts the missile system's great power. The cacti characterize the Arizona desert where the squadron operates. (Approved, 30 Jul 1987)
