902 Comptroller Squadron emblem

902 Comptroller Squadron emblem: On a disc parted per bend Or and Azure, between two laurels crossed at base and ascending to chief Vert, three lightning bolts emitting from chief Gules, points terminating to center base; all within a narrow border Blue. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "MAKING VISION REALITY" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "902D COMPTROLLER SQ" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The wreath signifies meritorious achievement and refers to the manner in which the mission is accomplished by effectively utilizing financial resources. The lightning bolts refer to the speed and power of finance personnel in performing the duty required of them to be judicious, timely and skilled stewards of Air Force funds. This emblem personifies the mission of all finance personnel who prudently manage the nation's finances to protect the United States of America.
