EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a pheon point to base the staff as a torch Or, detailed of the field, enflamed Argent, fimbriated of the second, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "902D LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in Yellow letters. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "SERVICE TEAMWORK EXCELLENCE" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The torch represents the leadership role of the Squadron in executing its full spectrum logistics mission. The flame symbolizes the untiring dedication and commitment of the men and women to the Air Force mission. The pheon represents logistics readiness, preparedness and the art and science of logistics technology, education and management. When combined, the pheon, torch and flame symbolize Integrity, Service and Excellence--the Air Force Core Values that guide and bind all Air Force personnel together each day, demonstrating that their word is their bond.
