Per fess embattled Azure and Gules, a Pegasus rampant Argent atop a globe in base of the first gridlined of the third; all within a diminished bordure Sable. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red wall depicts the valor exhibited by unit personnel in supporting its objectives. The Pegasus represents the squadron's ability to support any airlift mission with both personnel and materiel.
