EMBLEM





910 Combat Support Squadron emblem: On an Air Force yellow disc within a narrow red border a bent figure in olive fatigues. face and hands apricot, wearing black shoes, detailed white, supporting on his back a white aircraft with a red nose band, in the aircraft a pilot, face apricot, wearing an olive flightsuit black helmet and goggles detailed white. and a white scarf all detailed and outlined black. on the horizon in the base of the disc a black flightline. Below the disc a blank Air Force yellow scroll bordered red. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. The figure bearing the aircraft symbolized the support given to the pilot and his plane by the unit while the hangers and the control towers depict the area where the mission is performed. (Approved 13 May 1964)





On a disc Azure issuant from base a stylized wing bendwise sinister throughout Or detailed of the field, in dexter flank three mullets bendwise in pile Argent, in chief a globe on its axis Proper landmasses displayed Yellow gridlined Sable, all within a diminished bordure Blue. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "910TH MISSION SUPPORT SQ" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "WIND BENEATH THE WING" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The stylized wing is reminiscent of a human hand alluding to the unit's support of the airlift mission. The stars symbolize clarity, integrity, knowledge and strength. The globe reflects the Squadron's devotion to supporting wing personnel while maintaining its own global mission capability. (Approved, 15 May 2001)
