EMBLEM



On a disc Azure, a mechanic's wrench and screwdriver in saltire Argent, the latter handled Vert, between two wings volant of the second, detailed and fimbriated Or, and attached to a globe in base of the third, tilted bendwise grid lined Sable and environed bend sinisterwise by a flight symbol of the fourth, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "WE KEEP'EM FLYING" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed 911TH AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE SQ in Yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The wrench and screwdriver symbolize the maintenance profession. The wings upright represents the unit's affiliation and adaptability with maintenance flight. The globe and encompassing flight symbol shows the unit's worldwide capabilities and operations.
