Azure, a pall Celeste overall a mullet Argent winged Or outlined and detailed Gules; all within a diminished bordure Yellow. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The pall suggests a convergence of pathways traveled by the unit as it performs its mission. The star represents the Wing's personnel and the sacrifices and services that are made to help preserve the nation's freedoms. The wings symbolize the equipment and support elements that are a vital part of the Wing's functions.
