EMBLEM



914 Tactical Clinic On a blue disc, the symbols for man and woman conjoined horizontally, both red, overall a yellow winged staff entwined by two red snakes, all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc a green scroll with a narrow yellow border and attached below the disc a green scroll inscribed "HEALTH CARE FOR PEOPLE" in black letters with a narrow yellow border. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The caduceus is a symbol for medicine and denotes the mission of the unit. The two red symbols, referring to man and woman, symbolize people. The emblems on the design are a symbolic representation of the motto. (Approved, 15 Aug 1985)
