EMBLEM

On a disc Celeste, an eagle at honor point volant rising Brown, beak and lower legs Or, between two mullets in fess and a polestar in chief Azure and above two swords chevronwise Or, hilts Vert, all within a diminished border Blue. Attached below the disc, a Light Blue scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "914TH COMBAT COMM FLT" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The eagle, our national symbol, represents an orbiting geosynchronous satellite, central to the unit's mission. The two swords with converging points symbolize honor, power and might. The sword bells, hand guards and hand guard ornaments resemble two mobilized quick response satellite antennae. The swords are aligned to hit a single point in space, much like a tactical point-to-point communications scenario. The three stars denote the vastness of space.
