EMBLEM



On a disc Purpure, a stylized quad armed figure Buff, loin cloth of the first, his dexter boot Or, grasping in his lower dexter and sinister hands two torches, handles Vert, rims of the second, both enflamed of the third, all details and cracks Sable, supporting on his back a globe Azure, terrestrial land masses of the fourth, all within a narrow Yellow border. Attached above the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "MANY IN BODY ONE IN MIND" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "914TH FORCE SUPPORT SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine Blue and Air Force Yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The purple background represents the patience, sacrifice and loyalty unit members contribute to a successful services empire. The buff colored four-armed figure signifies the unit member and unselfish attitude while balancing the multiple operations of Services, Civilian Personnel, Airman and Family Readiness and the Military Personnel Section. The right foot is stabilizing the customers and their needs, symbolized by the cracks below the figure. The Air Force blue and emerald in the globe represents the theater of operations and integrates adaptability and hope. The globe, also, endorses the parent Wing's vision statement: "Rapid

global reach, fueled by citizen Airmen; whenever asked, wherever tasked.” The Air Force yellow flames on the emerald torch symbolize the high value of service and commitment towards the comfort and needs of all. (Approved, 21 Mar 2022)
