EMBLEM



914 Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron emblem: On an ultramarine blue disc, a rainbow divided top to bottom; scarlet, yellow, green, ultramarine blue, and scarlet issuing in perspective from lower left to middle right surmounted in upper left by a silver gray and gold compass rose with an ultramarine blue center charged with a yellow lightning flash and a silver gray wrench crossed saltirewise, and in lower right a silver gray eagle in flight; all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc a green scroll edged with a narrow yellow border and inscribed WE PUT IT ALL TOGETHER in scarlet letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The compass, lightning bolt and wrench symbolize the maintenance mission of the unit and the fact that this service can deploy and function anywhere on the earth that aircraft travel. The rainbow signifies the multi-faceted maintenance capabilities

of the Unit. The eagle represents the Air Force and its ability to deploy aircraft to all points of the compass with the technicians to keep the planes flying. (Approved, 11 Dec 1987)
