EMBLEM



On a disc Azure, below and in front of the head of an American bald eagle affronté Proper, a hemisphere Vert, gridlined Sable, issuing from sinister base a lighthouse garnished with alternating Black and White bands, lighted and emitting three rays of light to dexter base overall Or, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "SUSTAINING THE FIGHT" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "916TH LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The American bald eagle represents the unit's strength, bravery, courage and honor. The lighthouse symbolizes teams working together as a beacon of purpose, resolve and excellence. The globe refers to the global support provided by the unit. (Approved, 14 Jun 2004)
