EMBLEM



On a disc Azure gridlined Sable, overall a stylized head of a bird of prey erased to the field Or charged by two bayonets Proper in saltire; all within a narrow Black border. Attached above the disc, a Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "MOBILE DEFENSE GLOBAL REACH" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Gray scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "916TH SECURITY FORCES SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine Blue and Air Force Yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe represents the worldwide reach of the unit's operation. The bird of prey highlights the unit's vigilance and determination to provide protection.
