EMBLEM



On a disc Azure, issuant from an increscent in sinister Silver Gray, a fox head in profile to dexter erased at the ears Proper, in dexter chief an arc of three mullets Or, all within a narrow border Black. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed

“919TH FORCE SUPPORT SQ” in Black letters. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed “IN PEOPLE LIES STRENGTH” in Black letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The fox signifies intelligence and represents the Squadron members as providers. The crescent is symbolic of Special Operations during the night. The three stars depict the three major components of the Force Support Squadron: Education, Personnel and Services.
