In November 1953, the Early Warning unit (N-30) began operations at their new home at Cape Warwick on Resolution Island, Northwest Territories. The island is across from the southern tip of Baffin Island. The station was phased out on 1 November 1961. Frobisher Bay, Northwest Territories 920th AWN Squadron: activated in Nov 51 at Grenier AFB, NH, as the 152nd ACEW Group; moved

to Resolution Isl Air Station, Canada (NEAC) on 19 Jan 52; reassigned to ADC and 4733rd Air Division Group on 1 Apr 57; transferred to 4732nd Air Division Group on 1 May 58; transferred to

Goose ADS on 1 Apr 60; discontinued on 1 Nov 61.

Otter performed many functions including mail, small supply delivery, medical evacuation, and Force. It was renamed McAndrew AFB in 1948. It was a NEAC major supply centre for northern bases and sites. In the Spring of 1952, the base became part of the 64th Air Division (Defense). McAndrew was also temporary home to the 920th AC&W Squadron from July 1953 to November 1954. In 1954, the USAF commenced inactivation in preparation for turnover of the site to the US Navy in 1955.
