EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, rimmed with ten mullets Argent, a torteau surmounted by a winged Rod of Aesclapius Or, detailed Gules and Sanguine, serpent Argent, eyed of the fifth, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "926TH AEROSPACE MEDICINE SQ" in Yellow letters. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "SALUS MILITI SUPREMA LEX" in Yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. A winged Rod of Aesclapius, the traditional symbol of medicine and healing, also symbolizes the Squadron's mission. The traditional rod is replaced with a spear, representing the warrior and strength at a distance. The entire emblem is formed to suggest a fleur-de-lis, the historical emblem associated with the origins of the 926th Group in New Orleans, depicting illumination and purity. The scarlet disc represents the blood spilled in defense of the United States and the protection afforded the warrior in good health. The stars represent the air and space environment in which the Air Force dominates. The ten stars are symbolic of the 10th Air Force, the unit's parent MAJCOM and also memorialize the 10 years between the events of September 11, 2001 and the designation of the unit as a full squadron.
